#### A 4.4 Automatic collocation analysis of emotion terms

The automatic analysis of collocation in the four BRC registers uses a span of -3 to +3, the log-likelihood measure of statistical significance and the whole BNC as basis (calculated via the BNCweb interface at http://escorp.unizh.ch/).
